Let's go Video Tour - Learning from Watching

I believe that 50% of surgery is incision and the remaining 50% is suture. A good incision leads to ideal flap manipulation, and good sutures allow excellent healing. Rather than the conventional incision, which was performed in a customary way, we are going to look into what is a good incision that helps lift the flap and enables access to the instrument and securing the field of view. I would like to introduce a good suture technique that allows healing to the extent that it can be said that it can already be healed the moment it is sutured by giving various vectors beyond the conventional surgery that was completed with only simple suture. I hope that through this, we will always be able to get better healing.

In particular, this lecture seeks to deliver a more visually effective message through surgery videos. In surgery, the entire process from incision to suturing is a dynamic procedure. Parts that are difficult to convey with only 2D images in textbooks can be conveyed in videos. Therefore, many academic societies are conducting lectures through videos of surgery. We hope that you will get a lot of good ideas from this lecture through various versions of surgeries performed continuously with flow.
