

Clinical Practice in Dentistry for Persons with Disabilities

With the growing emphasis on public-private collaboration under the 'Act on Guarantee of Right to Health for Persons with Disabilities,' private dental clinics have become the primary frontline for implementing these rights. This lecture moves beyond policy discourse to outline a systematic 'risk-based treatment strategy' that integrates the assessment of both systemic health and disability-specific characteristics. Establishing safe outpatient protocols through the pre-evaluation of complex medical and behavioral traits is a core competency for modern clinicians. This session explores how the fundamental values of health rights can be manifested within the dental clinic to enhance clinical confidence. Ultimately, it seeks to provide a predictable framework for treating patients with disabilities in everyday practice.
