Indirect Chef (Inlay)

In cases of proximal caries or failures of previous Class II restorations, an indirect restoration may be the treatment of choice. While gold—long considered the gold standard in indirect restorations—remains a viable option, its use has decreased due to rising material costs and the increased precision of CAD/CAM restorations. As a result, indirect restorations using composite resin or ceramic are becoming more prevalent. This lecture will also cover the clinical considerations associated with each material. A thorough understanding of cavity preparation and the bonding protocol for indirect restorations will be central to the discussion.
